

COMMUNICATIONS

The first International Congress of Mycenaeanology will be held in Rome under the auspices of the National Council of Research in September 1967.

The Congress will be organized in three sections: 1) Archaeological, 2) Philological, 3) Historical. For each of these sections are foreseen basic reports given by chosen specialists, and information on particular themes.

Evangelia Protonotariou-Deilaki has suggested that the "Lion Gate" is in fact rather to be seen as a "Gryphon-Gate" with two winged Gryphons so that the scheme most closely resembled this seal. (M. Paraskevaidis in Kathimerini, 5 June 1966.)

An expedition from the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institute under the direction of James W. Mayor is reported by the Associated Press to be preparing to search this fall under the waters off Santorini for cities belonging to Atlantis, "the flourishing pre-historic city inundated within minutes by one of the great natural catastrophes of history."
